#### **CONTRACT AGREEMENT**

# URBAN PIPE CROSSING VIDEO INSPECTION CONTRACT NO. 20-001

ARTICLE I. - WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the payments and agreements hereinafter mentioned to be made and performed by the said party of the first part under the conditions expressed in the two bonds bearing even date with these presents and hereunto annexed, the said party of the second part agrees with the said party of the first part, at his own proper cost and expense, to do all the work and furnish all the materials, except such as are mentioned in the specifications to be furnished by said party of the first part, necessary to construct and complete in a good, workmanlike and substantial manner and to the satisfaction of the District's Engineer, in accordance with the Special Provisions hereto annexed and also in accordance with California Code of Regulations Title 23, Waters, Division 1, Central Valley Flood Protection Board, Article 8 Standards, the Standard Specifications of the State of California Department of Transportation dated 2018, the Standard Plans dated May 2018, the "Labor Surcharge" and "Equipment Rental Rates" in effect on the date the work is accomplished, and the "General Prevailing Wage Rates" of the State of California Department of Transportation, which said Code of Regulations, Special Provisions, Standard Plans, Standard Specifications are hereby specially referred to and by such reference made a part hereof.

The Special Provisions and the project plans for the work to be done are entitled:

#### **URBAN PIPE CROSSING VIDEO INSPECTION**

Which are hereby made part of this contract.

ARTICLE II. – The said Contractor agrees to receive and accept the following prices as full compensation for furnishing all materials and for doing all the work contemplated and embraced in this Agreement; also for all loss or damage arising out of the nature of the work aforesaid, or from the action of the elements, or from any unforeseen difficulties or obstructions which may arise or be encountered in the prosecution of the work until its acceptance by the District for all risks of every description connected with the work; also for all expenses incurred by or in consequence of the suspension or discontinuance of work and for well and faithfully completing the work, and the whole thereof, in the manner and according to the plans and specifications and the requirements of the Engineer under them, to wit.

ARTICLE III. – The said party of the first part hereby promises and agrees with the said Contractor to employ, and does hereby employ, the said Contractor to provide the materials and to do the work according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the prices hereinafter set forth, and hereby contracts to pay the same at the

time, in the manner and upon the conditions above set forth; and the said parties for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained.

ARTICLE IV. – By my signature hereunder, as Contractor, I certify that I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Workers Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.

ARTICLE V. – It is further expressly agreed by and between the parties hereto that should there be any conflict between the terms of this instrument and the bid or proposal of said Contractor, then this instrument shall control and nothing herein shall be considered as an acceptance of the said terms of said proposal conflicting herewith.

ARTICLE VI. – Reclamation District No. 900 hereby employs Contractor to provide material and to do the work according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to for the following prices to be paid at the time, in the manner and upon the conditions hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE VII. – The improvement contemplated in the performance of this contract is an improvement over which Reclamation District No. 900 shall exercise general supervision.

ARTICLE VIII. – The statement of prevailing wages appearing in the General Prevailing Wage Rates is hereby specifically referred to and by this reference is made a part of this contract. It is further expressly agreed, by and between the terms of this instrument and the bid or proposal of said Contractor, that this instrument shall control and nothing herein shall be considered as an acceptance of the said terms of said proposal conflicting herewith.

Update on activities since the August 2020 Board of Trustees Meeting

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

This Staff Report is intended to report the noteworthy activities and events of the District. Noteworthy activity since the previous Board Meeting on 8/19/20

#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### 5.1.1. Administration Services

I have been working with Ralph Nevis to update the Conflict of Interest Code now that there is the new position for financial oversight to add, it was an appropriate time for a complete review. A draft for the Board's consideration is anticipated for October.

#### 5.1.2. District Operations

# 5.1.2.1. Flood Operations and Maintenance:

Fall inspections were completed by DWR on September 3<sup>rd</sup>; the timeline was moved up a month from usual. There were minor remarks about long grass in some areas due to the timing. There is also shrinkage cracking along the Deep Water Ship channel noted. That condition is fairly typical this time of year, but the concern is early heavy rains do not allow for expansion to close up the crack and can result in slips.

Review of the SWIF is underway; how to most efficiently addresses the various deficiencies for the progress report next year as well as long term, potentially through reconstruction projects.

## 5.1.2.2. <u>Internal Drainage Operations:</u>

One pump at SIP was pulled on September 3<sup>rd</sup> for unexpected repairs. The week prior it was discovered that water was making its way up to the motor and leaking on the deck. It was determined that the pump required pulling to repair seals and while this is being done the motor is being inspected and repaired as needed.

Lake Washington west of Enterprise Blvd has completely dried up. We have gone out and inspected the slopes along the lake. The slopes along the Sac West RV ltem 5.1 – Page 1

Park continue to erode and should be monitored to assess the rate at which this is incurring.

#### 5.1.3. Capital Improvement Projects

#### 5.1.3.1. Blacker Canal:

The process of securing funding is ongoing, no updates at this time.

#### 5.1.3.2. <u>889 Drever:</u>

The job walk is scheduled for September 14<sup>th</sup>, prospective bidders will be provided with plans and specifications. Bid opening is scheduled for October 5<sup>th</sup>.

### **5.1.4.** Agency Coordination:

## 5.1.4.1. <u>CVFPB</u>:

Due to AB 3226 not passing the process of assuming responsibility for MA4 has stalled until further legislation can be pursued next year. Discussions have also continued on possible alternate paths as a result of the LAFCo boundary change that occurred last year through the actions to incorporate RD 537.

#### 5.1.4.2. RD 537:

No updates at this time.

#### 5.1.4.3. <u>DWR:</u>

DWR has assured the LMAs that funding will be made available for another year of FMAP funding; but that the amounts awarded may be adjusted down to accommodate the budget needs.

#### 5.1.5. WSAFCA Updates

## 5.1.5.1. <u>USACE Yolo Bypass East Levee Projects:</u>

Safety Assurance Review is completed and comments are currently being addressed by the team. The 95% submittal deadline back to the Corps is on October 14<sup>th</sup>. There has been a proposed redesign of the seepage interceptor drainage into a newly constructed pump station, separating the flows from the Racetrack pump station.

### 5.1.6. Development Project Coordination:

No other projects to discuss at this time.
